FUNDER: Yapp Charitable Trust | NEXT DEADLINE: Rolling

Grants between £1,000 - £9,000 for registered charities with a total annual expenditure of less than £40,000 and that have been established for at least three years.

Priority groups (work must support one of these groups):

- Elderly people
- Children and young people aged 5 – 25
- People with physical impairments, learning difficulties or mental health challenges
- Social welfare – people trying to overcome life-limiting problems of a social, rather than medical, origin (such as addiction, relationship difficulties, abuse, offending)
- Education and learning (with a particular interest in people who are educationally disadvantaged, whether adults or children)

- We only make grants for core funding. We define core funding as the costs associated with regular activities or services that have been ongoing for at least a year.
- We cannot fund new projects, extra services or additional delivery cost
